Prevent the flu from taking center stage by getting a flu shot now. The vaccine requires about two weeks to start working, and flu season usually begins in October, peaking December through February! You're covered 100% for flu shots.²

Flu prevention starts with you

Getting a flu shot helps protect yourself, family, and friends from getting sick. You also protect those who are at higher risk for serious flu-related problems, such as young children, people 65 and older, and those with chronic health conditions.³

Flu shot facts⁴



It's safe.

You cannot get the flu from the flu shot. The virus in the vaccine is not active, so it can't infect you.



It's effective.

The flu shot prevents most flu cases. If you do get sick, it reduces the risk of a doctor visit by 40% to 60% and lessens the chance of hospitalization.



Its side effects are usually mild.

Most people have no symptoms, although some report arm soreness, fatigue, and muscle aches that go away within a few days.
